Mom's Spanish Rice

1 lb lean ground beef (90%) 1 Large Onion

1 Med. Green Pepper, chopped 1 can (15 oz) tomato sauce

1 can (14 1/2 oz) no-salt added diced tomatoes, drained 1 tsp. ground cumin 1/2 tsp. garlic powder 1/4 tsp salt

2 2/3 c. cooked brown rice chopped green onions, optional

1. In a large skillet, cook beef, onion and pepper over medium heat 6-8 min. or until beef is no longer pink and onion is tender, breaking up beef into crumbles; drain.

2. Stir in tomato sauce, tomatoes and seasonings, bring to a boil. Add rice, heat through, stirring occasionally. Garnish with green onions, if desired.
