Scams Yet Again

I really am sorry to spend so much time writing about scams, but I don't want any of you to be a victim. I am continually getting scam calls, so I am thinking that you are as well. Just the other day, I received a call and a recorded voice said that I had been overcharged on my National Grid bill and I was entitled to a refund. It then said to Press 1 for more information. Now I know that I was not over-charged and did not press 1 for more information. My guess was that they would ask for my name, address and bank information. Of course, the caller never did give the name of the company with which they were associated. Last week, while at work, I received a call for an extended warranty on my car. I thought that I would play along with this one. First question, What kind of car did I have? Answer: Cadillac. (I do not own a Cadillac.) Next question, what year? Answer: 2018. Next question, What model? I almost got stuck here, as I did not know the names of the Cadillac models. The caller was kind enough to start listing the models and I decided on an Eldorado. Before she could ask any more questions, I said let me ask you a question. My question: What city are you in? You probably know that when you receive a call, the city from which the caller is in, appears on your phone. This call was from Johnsonville, NY. Johnsonville is a hamlet located between Pittstown and Schaghticoke in Rensselaer County. She replied, "That is a great question and one that our specialist can answer." I said "I am asking you." Again she said, "That is a question our specialist can answer." I said "Okay then, let me ask you this, what country are you in?" Some scam calls are from countries outside the United States. She hung up on me. I am sharing these stories with you in the hope that you will be on the alert, should you receive one of these calls. From time to time, I do have members call me when they receive a call because these calls can sound so convincing. I received a call from a member who had just received a call from someone saying that her social security number showed inappropriate activity. She said she hung up on them. She did the right thing. I have received that type of call as well and did write about it in an early article. Please always be careful and feel free to give me a call here
