Spinach and Sun-Dried Tomato Pasta

Prep/Total Time: 20 Mins Serves: 6-8

Ingredients:

5 cups chopped fresh spinach

1 cup chopped yellow onion

1 tsp. kosher salt

1 1/2 cups heavy whipping cream

1 lb. uncooked penne pasta

2 tsp. sliced garlic

1/4 tsp. crushed red pepper

1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese, plus more to serve

2 cups leftover shredded Roasted Lemon-Pepper Chicken or rotisserie chicken

1 cup sliced oil-packed sun-dried tomatoes plus 1 Tbsp, oil from jar

2 Tbsp. leftover roasted garlic from Roasted Lemon-Pepper Chicken

Directions:

- 1. Place chopped fresh spinach in a colander in sink. Cook penne pasta in boiling salted water according to package directions for al dente. Reserve 1 cup cooking water; drain pasta over spinach. Set aside.
- 2. Heat sun-dried tomato oil over medium-high. Add sliced sun-dried tomatoes and chopped yellow onion; stir often, until tender, about 4 minutes. Add sliced garlic, leftover roasted garlic, kosher salt, and crushed red pepper; cook 1 minute.
- 3. Add heavy whipping cream; cook until reduced slightly, about 3 minutes.
- 4. Stir in pasta, spinach, grated Parmesan cheese, and shredded chicken. Stir to combine; add reserved pasta water gradually until pasta is saucy.
