#### Cooking with Ed

Friday, November 8th at 1:00pm Greek Chicken and Rice

Time: 30 Mins Serves: 4

1/4 teaspoon pepper

1/3 cup Greek olives, sliced

#### Ingredients:

1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

2 teaspoons olive oil

1 package (8.8 ounces) ready-to-serve brown rice

1 tablespoon minced fresh parsley 1 pound boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1-inch cubes

1 jar (12 ounces) marinated guartered artichoke hearts, drained and chopped

1 jar (12 ounces) roasted sweet red peppers, drained and chopped

1/3 cup oil-packed sun-dried tomatoes, chopped.

#### Directions:

1. Sprinkle chicken with garlic powder and pepper. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium heat. Add chicken; cook and stir until no longer pink, 8-10 minutes. Stir in artichokes, roasted peppers, tomatoes and olives. Cook and stir until heated through, 3-5 minutes.

2. Meanwhile, prepare rice according to package directions. Serve with chicken. Sprinkle with parsley.




