Bean and Chicken Sausage Stew

1 tbsp. olive oil 2 cloves garlic, thinly sliced 1-14.5 oz can low-sodium chicken broth 1 pkg baby spinach

1-13 oz. pkg. chicken sausage links, thinly sliced 1-19 oz can cannellini beans, drained and rinsed 1-14.5 oz can diced tomatoes Kosher salt and pepper

Heat oil in a large saucepan or Dutch oven over medium, heat. Add the sausage and cook, without turning, until browned, about 3 minutes.

Turn, add the garlic and cook for 2 minutes more. Add the beans, broth, and tomatoes and their liquid.

Bring to a simmer and cook over medium-high heat.

Add baby spinach to the pan and cook, stirring occasionally, until wilted, 2 to 3 minutes. Season with 1/4 tsp. each salt and pepper.

Serve with crusty bread.
