## Cooking with Ed

## Thai Peanut Chicken

Serves: 6 Prep/Cook Time: 30 mins

1/3 cup water

1/4 cup peanut butter

2 garlic cloves, minced

Sesame seeds, optional

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1/2 cup shredded carrots

## Ingredients:

8 ounces uncooked thick rice noodles

1/4 cup reduced-sodium soy sauce

4-1/2 teaspoons brown sugar

1/2 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes

2 tablespoons canola oil, divided

1 bunch broccoli, cut into florets

1 pound boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1/2-inch strips

## **Directions:**

- 1. Cook noodles according to package directions. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine water, soy sauce, peanut butter, brown sugar, lemon juice, garlic and pepper flakes; set aside.
- 2. In a large skillet, heat 1 tablespoon oil over medium-high heat. Add chicken; stir-fry until no longer pink, 3-4 minutes. Remove from pan.
- 3. Stir-fry broccoli and carrots in remaining oil until crisp-tender, 4-6 minutes. Add soy sauce mixture; bring to a boil. Cook and stir until sauce is thickened, 1-2 minutes. Return chicken to pan; heat through. Drain noodles; toss with chicken mixture in pan. If desired, sprinkle with sesame seeds.




